Born in King, Ontario to Jacob Jerome and Martha (McMurchy) Campbell. He was the older brother of **Norman Earl Campbell** and **Archibald Albert Campbell**.

He was admitted for shellshock at the Canadian Convalescent Hospital at Ramsgate.

Dec 6, 1916

Private Harold Campbell was discharged as he was no longer physically fit for war service. He continually struggled with shellshock and as a result he was always very nervous and had a hearing defect. When Private Harold Campbell was discharged he was missing 7 teeth. He took up a job as a salesman for Maclean's magazine following his return.

AFTER THE WAR

Private Harold Campbell was hit by shrapnel in the right thigh.

Jun 30, 1918

Age 25

Married Katy Irene Miller (age 19), daughter of John and Harriette Ann (Rumley) Miller of Meaford, Ontario. Together they had 5 children: Jean, Eleanor, Marlanne, Catherine and Roger Campbell.

May 10, 1971

Harold died in Toronto, Ontario. He is buried in the King City Cemetery in King City, Ontario.

Early Life



Earl was not the only Campbell son to fight in the Great War.

On May 22, 1915 Earl's older brother <u>Harold</u>, born February 19, 1893, joined the <u>Royal Canadian Dragoons</u> of Toronto at the age of 17. Although Harold was too short to be a "regular" he would be allowed to stay if he played the bugle. Undaunted, he said he could. In May of 1915 Harold enlisted in the <u>Van Doo</u>'s and was sent overseas. He saw action in Belgium and sustained head and leg wounds from shrapnel and was sent back to Canada.

After his discharge, Harold took a job as a salesman for Maclean's magazine. He married Katie Irene Miller.
