At the time of the wedding Earl Campbell worked as a farmer and Hazel Gambrill worked as a bookkeeper. They lived at W ½ of Lot 8, Con. 4, King Township, Ontario. They had 5 daughters: Clara, Gloria, Gerry, Earlene and Shirley Campbell.
