Sergeant Norman Eastwood was discharged for being physically unfit. He had partial ankylosis in his right wrist. This resulted from an impact fracture that he received on September 6, 1916 when he fell off a horse while on pass from Sacree Camp, Calgary. He was in the hospital for 25 days was unable to use his hand: "complains of persistent pain and loss of perfect mobility and strength in arm".
