Sentenced to 5 days of Field Punishment #1 for being drunk and being absent from parade.

Age 46

Promoted to Corporal.

**May 1, 1919**

Age 48

Married Isabel Lucas (age 34) of Westminster, England, daughter of Charles Lucas.

**Jan 31, 1920**

Age 49

Corporal Clarence Farr was discharged because of demobilization. He served in Canada and England.

**Nov 2, 1938**

Age 68

Clarence died.
