Married Veta Hazel Ward (age 21), daughter of James and Ella (Augusta) Ward of Toronto, Ontario. The wedding took place at Alfred's brother's home at 127 Borden Street, Toronto, Ontario. Following the wedding they took a motor trip to Buffalo, United States and planned on living in Aurora, Ontario.

Alfred and Veta had a baby boy, named Allan Folliott. Sometime in 1918, Allan was unofficially adopted by one of Veta's aunts, Iva Conover and he lived in Aurora, Ontario.

Awarded a Military Medal (medal for bravery).

Age 27

Acting Sergeant Major Alfred Folliott was discharged because he was deemed medically unfit due to his prior gunshot wound in his thigh and his persistent bronchitis.

Age 36

Veta (Ward) Folliott died at age 34 from acute myocarditis in Aurora, Ontario. She is buried at Aurora Cemetery, in Aurora, Ontario.

Jul 7, 1930

Age 38

Married Nina Kathleen Hall (age 40) in Hamilton, Ontario.

Alfred's son Allan died at 16 from tuberculous meningitis. He was a student at Jarvis Collegiate and was very prominent in sports, especially basketball. He is buried at Aurora Cemetery, in Aurora, Ontario with his mother Veta Folliott.

Lived with his wife Nina Kathleen Hall (age 45) at 1247 King Street, Hamilton, Ontario. Alfred Folliott worked as an auto dealer.

Alfred Folliott died in Galt, Ontario. He is buried at Mountview Cemetery in Cambridge, Ontario.

Sergt. A. L. Folliott Wins Military Medal for Capturing Batch of Germans.

How He Won M. M.

Prominent among those who arrived is Sergt. A. L. Folliott, M. M., of Aurora. Sergt. Folliott left Canada in April, 1917, with the 4th C. M. R. He was decorated after the battle of Arras, for putting a German machine gun stronghold out of commission. When this nest began to hold up the advance, Sergt. Folliott sneaked up on it and lobbed over a bomb or two. Instantly the fourteen Huns, who manned it, threw up their hands and cried "kamerad." surrendering their three machine guns. Sergt. Folliott was put out of action soon afterwards when wounded on September 27, 1918, in the fight on the Canal du Nord. Throughout the remainder of his fighting days he kept track of the Germans he was able to slay. He has fourteen notches on his rifle butt and, in addition, has several prisoners to his credit. His neck shows three round scars close together, where he was wounded by machine gun fire at Amiens on August 8, 1918.


