Mr. Strachan Symington was best man, and the ushers were: Mr. James Gill, cousin of the bride, and Mr. Colin Gray, brother of the groom. Mr. and Mrs. Cole held a reception after the ceremony at their home, 101 O'Hara avenue, the latter wearing gold cloth and black charmeuse, a small black hat and corsage bouquet of violets, centred with a rose. Mr. and Mrs. Gray left later for a short wedding trip west, the bride going away in a fawn suit embroidered in black, a fawn hat with feathers, and otter furs.
