## AFTER THE WAR

1921 Census

Age 23

He lived on Wells Street in Aurora, Ontario with George Teasdale (head of house – father, age 65), Maggie Teasdale (mother, age 59), Edith Teasdale (sister, age 25) and George Teasdale (brother, age 19).

Sep 22, 1923

Age 26

Edward married Catherine Wood (age 27), daughter of Charles and Louise (Dunning) Wood of Aurora, Ontario. At the time of their marriage Edward worked as a commercial traveller and Catharine was a school teacher.

**May 21, 1941**

Age 26

Catherine died at age 44 in Aurora, Ontario.

**Oct 13, 1941**

Age 26

He married Ida Irene Smith (age 39), daughter of Edmund and Maggie (McCullough) Smith in Niagara Falls, Ontario.

**Mar 20, 1960**

Age 62

Edward died in St. Catharines, Ontario. He is buried in Victoria Lawn Cemetery in St. Catharines, Ontario.

**TEASDALE—WOOD.**

Lawnridge, Aurora, was the scene of a pretty wedding last Saturday, September 22, when Catherine Orville, daughter of Mrs. Wood and the late Mr. C. F. Wood, became the bride of Edward H. Teasdale, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Teasdale of Aurora. Rev. T. Laidlaw officiated, assisted by Rev. W. H. Madden. The bride, who was given away by her uncle, Mr. D. Wood, of Minnasing, looked very pretty in a gown of peach-colored crepe de chine, and tulle veil, caught with orange blossoms. She carried a shower bouquet of Ophelia roses and lilies of the valley. The bridesmaid was Miss Bertha Wood, sister of the bride, wearing a gown of pale blue crepe de chine, and carrying sunset roses, while the groom was supported by his brother, Mr. George A. Teasdale. The Wedding March from Lohengrin was played by Miss Mary Teasdale of Toronto. After the reception the happy couple left for Ottawa and Montreal, the bride travelling in a suit of navy tricotine, with cocoa brown hat and brown fox fur. Upon their return they will reside in St. Catharines.
