Dec 27, 1968

Age 78

William Maurice Watson died in Owen Sound, Ontario. He is buried in Greenwood Cemetery in Owen Sound, Ontario.

KETTLEBY SOLDIER HOME.

Aurora, Jan. 3.—(Special.) — Pte. Maurice Watson, who was gassed at St. Julien, reached here to-day and was given a warm welcome by Mayor Baldwin, J. M. Walton and the overseas men of the 12th York Rangers with drum and bugle band. A procession was formed, the school children taking part. Pte. Watson, who is a son of Levi T. Watson of Kettleby, was later escorted home, where he was met by a party of farmers sons on horseback.

Mr. Barnum was best man and after the ceremony Mr. and Mrs. Watson left for Muskoka. On their return they will reside at 62 St. Marys street. Among the gifts were a club bag and purse of gold from the staff of the Bank of Commerce.
